AN OPPORTUNITY FOR CONTEMPORARY MUSICIANS AND EDUCATORS

POSITION SUMMARY:

Music Teachers will be responsible for the creation, implementation, teaching, and assessment of a 2 or 7 week course. The teacher will be responsible for leading four 50-minute classes daily at Usdan Summer Camp for the Arts, in Huntington, Long Island, NY. Students, grades 3-12, are placed into four levels based on their current grade in school.

POSITIONS AVAILABLE IN:

Clarinet, Violin, Piano, Guitar, Guitar/Ukulele, Low Brass (Trombone, Baritone, Tuba), Bassoon, Early Childhood Music/ORFF and Alto Saxophone.

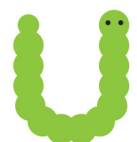
Choral Conductor (elementary) and Orchestra Conductor (middle and high school).

TRAITS AND CHARACTERISTICS:

Teachers will be passionate musicians and educators with a focus growing and learning. They will seek rigorous exploration of ideas, have a willingness to try new things, and be open to and interested in feedback. They will work enthusiastically with children, with an understanding of their needs both individually and in the modern world. Usdan teachers will be flexible both in and out of the classroom and interested in collaboration with Usdan's faculty within and across disciplines. They will be authentic, reliable, respectful, thoughtful, and organized.

ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Work with the Music Department Chair and/or with the Administrative staff to set goals for the class and plan the student experience.
- Submit course plans prior to the start of camp.
- Communicate all pre-season requests for music and methods books to the Chair or Administrative Staff.
- Teach four hours per day and prepare for each class.
- Prepare students for all solo, chamber and ensemble performances.
- Audition and rank students, in collaboration with the large ensemble conductors.
- Supervise students at daily assemblies and in passing periods.
- Attend department and staff meetings and trainings as required.
- Prepare for performances, when relevant.
- Lead or attend one 1-hour professional development workshop after camp hours.
- Have student safety as a top priority at all times.
- Create a joyful, fun and engaging atmosphere in the studio.
- Use inquiry, exploration and experimentation as primary teaching tools.
- Differentiate instruction to be both challenging and developmentally appropriate for each student's age and ability, which varies within and across classes.



- Teach skills that are both technical and cognitive. Encourage students to explore ideas and their art form and to actively reflect on the process.
- Have a curriculum that is rooted in diversity by incorporating and encouraging multiple perspectives from historic and music content.
- Create an environment where teachers are learners, there is respect and trust among all participants, and a belief in student capacities.
- Model the behaviors of musicians and artists, how they think, work, and live.
- Two week session teachers will collaborate with one other teacher to create a cohesive program for students.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Bachelor's degree in music, music education, or equivalent knowledge, skills, and abilities.
- A minimum of one year of teaching experience, preferably with students of varying ages and abilities.
- Be an active musician, with recent performances and knowledge of contemporary music teaching practices.
- Experience teaching in group or sectional settings.
- Must be certified in Child Abuse and Neglect/Maltreatment Identification (can be obtained online at no cost).

2017 SUMMER SEASON DATES, TIMES AND LOCATION:

- Orientation Day, Wednesday, June 21, 2:30 PM - 8:30 PM.
- New teacher orientation, date and time to be determined.
- Monday - Friday, June 26 - August 11, 9:15 AM - 3:15 PM (Usdan is closed on July 4).
 - A limited number of offers will be for 2 week sessions.

SALARY AND BENEFITS:

- Salary commensurate with experience; 7 weeks \$6000-\$7000.
- We encourage our faculty and staff to utilize Usdan for their own artistic purposes. Proposals for pre and post season studio use are welcome.
- Discounts for children of faculty.
- Transportation:
 - Free parking on campus
 - NYC faculty also has the option on a subsidized train ride or faculty bus with central pickups for a maximum out-of-pocket cost of \$350.

 - Daily faculty swim.
 - Lead or attend workshops with other faculty and staff such as yoga, archery, gardening, theater, dance, music and art.
